

Over 200 Journalists from around the World to Cover US President Joe Biden's Visit to Israel

As part of the extensive operation to cover the visit, the Government Press Office (GPO) will open and manage an advanced international press center to meet the needs of foreign and Israeli journalists alike.

Hundreds of journalists from around the world are expected to arrive in Israel in the coming days, ahead of US President Joe Biden's official visit to Israel.

President Biden will land at Ben-Gurion International Airport on Wednesday afternoon for a two-day visit that will conclude Friday morning with his departure for Saudi Arabia.

As part of the extensive coverage operation directed by the Public Diplomacy Directorate, the GPO will open and manage an international press center to meet the needs of foreign and Israeli journalists alike. The center will be located in Mishkenot Sha'ananim, opposite the Old City walls and near the focal points of the visit, and will allow the many journalists to closely monitor all the events and transmit them directly to their agencies around the world.

On the eve of President Biden's visit, a special flight will arrive with approximately 100 American journalists who are part of the President's entourage. Among the main networks that have already filed applications for GPO services are the White House correspondents from – inter alia – CNN, Fox News, CBS. The New York Times, The Washington Post and The Wall Street Journal.
